Key points of the ranking



Relevance of the ranking

The **UK continues to face substantial labour shortages**: a persistent challenge driven by the long-term impacts of COVID-19, Brexit, and structural issues such as skills mismatches, an ageing workforce, and rising economic inactivity. Currently, 13% of the UK workforce is affected by significant gaps in essential employment skills. Projections suggest that this proportion could increase to 22% by 2035⁽¹⁾.

To address the skills mismatch, companies should focus on **enhancing the appeal of their workplaces** to both current and prospective employees.

Summary

The UK's Best Employers 2026 have been identified in an independent survey from a vast sample of British employees working for companies employing **at least 250 people** within UK.

The survey was conducted using **open survey on ft.com** and **several online access panels**, providing a representative samples of the workforce employed by large organizations in each country. The employees have not been consulted via their employers but **anonymously** through several online panels. By doing so, the employee could openly state their opinion, avoiding any influence from their employer. Each respondent was asked which firm or institution he or she works for in an open-ended question and with an autofill option. The survey was conducted based around companies **from all sectors** with more than 250 employees in the UK. In total, the survey took an average of 8-10 minutes to complete. Over **400,000 employer evaluations** covering the current and previous year were considered.

The final score is based on two types of evaluations: **personal recommendation** (the willingness of employees to recommend their employer) and **public recommendation** (the willingness of employees to recommend other employers from the industry in which they are currently employed), with a higher weighting for direct recommendation.

The **500 companies** receiving the highest total scores are awarded as "UK's Best Employers 2026."


The UK's Best Employers follows the following approach

Data-based results



The score is based on two components: **1) Personal recommendations** and **2) Public recommendations**

Scoring Modell



To ensure continuity in assessing employer reputation, data from the previous year is included in the calculation with a lower weighting.
