Rating Process, Subject areas, Data evaluation and validation

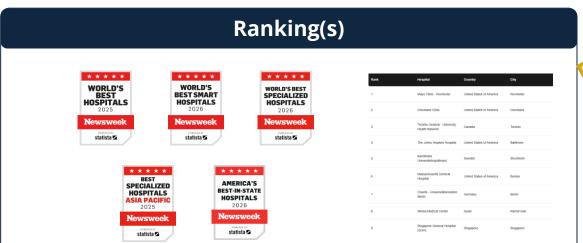






Independently of the well-established hospital rankings, Statista and Newsweek have launched the "Global Hospital Rating" – a star rating system for hospitals

Hospital rankings vs. Global Hospital Rating



- > A data-based comparison of **hospitals** resulting in a **hierarchical ranking**
- > Includes up to **2,400 hospitals** across **30 countries** and various medical fields
- > Based on a reputation **survey** and (where available) hospital **quality metrics data**
- > **No application** necessary inclusion based on available data and survey results



- > A comprehensive hospital rating system identifying a hospital's strengths and areas of improvement in various subject areas in comparison to pre-defined performance tiers and international standards based on data submitted by the hospital
- A star system, awarding hospitals a rating between 1 and 5 stars
- > Application based data submitted by hospital to Statista via a survey



Once the rating survey is submitted by the hospital, Statista will validate the information via documentation and video calls and finally issue a rating

Global Hospital Rating process

Step 2:

Hospital **completes the survey** and submits their data for evaluation. The reported data falls into each of these five subject areas: Provision of Care, Timeliness of Care, Patient Experience & Safety, IT & Healthcare Technology and Employer Attractiveness.

Step 4:

Statista issues the **final rating**. The results are available on Newsweek and Statista. Hospitals with 3+ stars are eligible to use the official Global Hospital Rating logo.

1. Registration



2. Survey



3. Evaluation and Validation



4. Rating

Step 1:

The hospital **registers** for participation in the rating on www.globalhospitalrating.com

Step 3:

To ensure data quality and consistency, Statista **evaluates and validates** the submitted hospital data.

As part of this process, video calls with the hospitals are conducted to clarify questions after the data submission.





Hospitals report data in five different subject areas which Statista evaluates to determine the final rating for the hospital

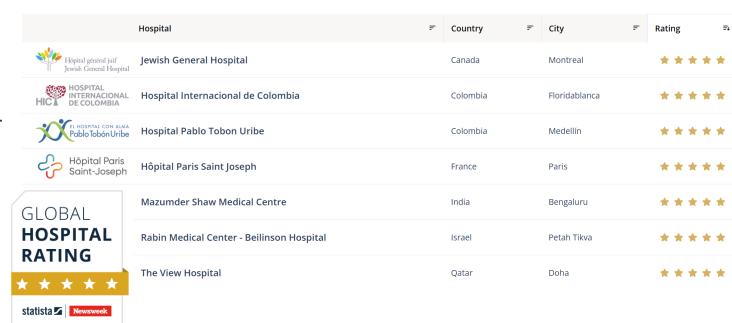

Statista and Newsweek have a strict data evaluation and validation process to ensure the quality and validity of the data

Data evaluation and validation

- Based on the data submitted by the hospital, the analyst team conducts a data-driven assessment across five categories. This results in individual star ratings for each category and a final overall star rating.
- The indicators are analyzed based on international standards
- To ensure the accuracy and quality of the data Statista conducts quality and consistency checks of all data/proof submitted by the hospital
- A 1–2-hour call to address open questions is scheduled with the hospital within 10-15 business days of data submission



ONCE THE EVALUATION AND VALIDATION HAVE BEEN CONCLUDED, STATISTA AND NEWSWEEK ISSUE THE STAR RATING FOR THE HOSPITAL (1-2)
